Johnny Gruelle was an extremely talented cartoonist, illustrator, and storyteller. Raggedy Ann is a character created by American writer Johnny Gruelle (1880–1938) that appeared in a series of books he wrote and illustrated for young children. Raggedy Ann is a rag doll with red yarn for hair and a triangle nose. Johnny Gruelle received US Patent 1,477,899 for his Raggedy Ann doll on September 7, 1915. The character was created in 1915 as a doll, and was introduced to the world in *The Raggedy Ann Stories: The Very First Raggedy Ann Stories* [Johnny Gruelle] on Amazon. \*Free\* shipping on qualifying offers.
