Different impact on silk industry in japan and korea the silk crisis occurred in june 1930 was a turning point of silk industry in japan. every index showed rapid growth until 1929. for example, annual growth rate of raw silk production was 7 to 12 per cent between 1924 and 1929. after the silk crisis, however, it reduced to 0.6 per cent in 1930.
